This challenge is for you to make a mixed media tag that has at least five different fibers (fabric, paper, and/or other woven materials) on the front. Use the provided PDF or use a blank tag that you may already have. Have fun and don't forget to post your Five Fiber Tags to Instagram and Facebook. Use the #stircrazyvam and #fivefibertag so we can see all your wonderful work!

GUIDELINES

- Use at least five different fibers (fabric, paper, and/or other woven materials).
- · Five fibers must be noticeable on the front of the tag.

SUGGESTED MATERIALS

- Paints, markers, inks, gel prints, pastels, stencils, stamps, texture paste, wire, chains, charms, etc.
- · Use any adhesive, glue, or gel medium you like.
- Hand dyed or painted fabric, lace/doilies, burlap, cheesecloth, mesh, canvas, silk, felt, coffee
 filters/teabags, paper bags, rice/mulberry or other specialty paper, cardboard, construction
 paper, paper towel, tissue paper, dryer sheets, string, raffia, ribbon, yarn, jute, metallic thread,
 produce bags, etc.

INSTRUCTIONS

- · Use the PDF tag template provided in this link or a tag that you already have.
- Tag template link https://tinyurl.com/r8xoy6s
- · Two ways to make the blank tag -
- Print the PDF (cardstock works well), then cut out one template and draw around it onto stiffer material (such as cardboard).

OR

Print PDF, cutout, and glue two or more tags together to make a stiff tag.

TIPS

- Hole-punch each cutout before gluing tags together.
- To make the tags more original avoid using pattern/printed commercial fabrics, if possible.
